Speaker Information

Rosemary Scott is the Speech Pathologist for the Disabled Student Programs and Services and the former Coordinator of the Pasadena City College Speech-Language Pathology Assistant Program (1999-2016) and Associate Professor at PCC. She is a practicing SLP in voice and “Speech Consultant” for the Tournament of Roses. SLPAs from PCC are employed in public schools, hospitals and private practices. Rosemary served two terms on the California Speech-Language-Hearing Association Board (CSHA), as Secretary from 2012 to 2016. At the 2017 CSHA Convention in Pasadena, she was awarded CSHA “Fellow of the Association.” Rosemary has been a frequent presenter in supervision. Rosemary was on the ASHA Ad-Hoc Committee which created the Speech-Language Pathology Assistant Scope of Practice (ASHA, 2013).

Course Description

This workshop will instruct in supervision across the spectrum of supervisees from students to Speech-Language Pathology Assistants to Speech Pathologists completing their Required Professional Experience (RPE) with SLP AHADB updates in supervision explored and the Speech-Language Pathology Assistant Scope of Practice (ASHA, 2013) and revisions to the updated ASHA Code of Ethics (2016). Supervision is a part of the SLP's scope of practice! However, the "A, B, C's" of preparation to supervise, planning and time management, encouraging growth of the supervisee and dealing with the realities of every day practice and caseloads can affect all SLPs and their supervisees! Strategies will be emphasized to handle supervision and clinical practice. Internet resources and technology will be identified and examined.
